Not a crown IN Heaven but crowned WITH Heaven

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Greetings! Good News from Western Zambia, Kalabo, where we are doing missionary outreach bringing the gospel of God's grace to people. I'm sitting here on a runway. I just decided to get out of town a little bit. Just outside of town they have this airstrip and there's never an airplane here. I think in three months we had one plane land here and I've decided to just sit on the side of the runway here. There's nobody walking here. It's basically a private and quiet area here and I thought, "Let me come and sit here. There's not a lot of wind on this beautiful day, and let me just bring you the good news of Jesus Christ." Glory to God!

Let us just pray together as we start our service...

"Father, I want to thank You for Your love and Your grace. I want to thank You that You care for us. I want to thank You that I can preach this message with boldness today and that I can just bring the message of Your love and Your life that You've given to people. Thank You that You were raised from the dead and You've given us eternal life as a gift. That eternal life is possessed by us and as we know we have life that cannot end, life that cannot be destroyed. We have a robustness about us that is greater than things of his world. Even if this world brings its problems and its difficulty, we have a life that is only born from You. Therefore, even in our mortal bodies, even in these jars of clay, we can see the power of the gospel show forth in us. Glory to God! Amen and amen

I want to give a little bit of a report back on what we are doing. This week we continued with our building project and we finished the slab and everything that needs to be finished. I will, for those who are following us in our Zambia outreach group on WhatsApp and on telegram, it'll be updated and I think I'll put a photo to Facebook as well. We have also been fixing a road in the market area and we've got this project that we are calling, "Happy New Year, Kalabo!" We wanted to do it at the end of December but we are just too busy and didn't have time for that so we got to do it now. It's very rainy and we are just fixing potholes. That's what we are doing. It's a very simple project. It's not big. We are not resurfacing the road or anything like that. We are not a company that fixes roads. It's just that we just felt to fill up the potholes and just make it easier for people to travel in that area, especially for little cars because those potholes will fill up with water and they are massive. Some of the engine will get into water if they go through this. So, we filled it up and had a massive impact on the community. I never thought that something like that could have such a massive impact. You know, we have been drilling wells in this area and we find that the people are happy about it but fixing that road had more of an impact on the community than any well I've ever drilled. It's amazing! Now, obviously, we don't drill wells to have an impact. We drill wells so that people can have water and we fix the roads so that people can drive better. But it is amazing to see the impact it had on people wanting to know who we are and what we do, radio interview. People are opening up for

the gospel. People are saying, "I don't know what church you are of, but I want to come to your church." People that say, "This is a true church. Like not begging from us. They bring something to us." Now, we are not the only people who have ever done that. The church in Africa has done this as basically, international church coming to Africa has done this for many, many years. But it is just interesting to see the impact that it had. So, that's what we have been doing in this... awesome!

Now, I am not sure, but we are planning to go back in about two weeks. Every time something happens that we have to stay longer but we are truly, I feel in my heart that we have now come to the end of our time here for the next few months. I'll go back to South Africa and then I want to remind all of you, that now I think it, will be in November in Branson, Missouri. We are having a conference there, a gathering called, "Brighter Together", where Greg Henry and I and some people from different countries in the world come together and we are going to be ministering the grace of God, teaching the grace of God. And also, just having fellowship, groups fellowshipping, talking about the message of grace. Many people on our internet fellowship don't go to churches. I think one day I did a bit of a stats on this and I think that less than one-third is in the church and people are need our fellowship. So, Greg decided, "Let's have a meeting." I have spoken to him about this long ago as well, but it was truly something that was in his heart and I just feel one-hundred percent with him and we are doing this together as Dynamic Love Ministries and the Gospel Evolution Church, having this meeting. It is going to be absolutely awesome! I'm looking forward to it. So, look at the link in the description of this video and see that you get there if you want to be there. It would be wonderful to have you be there. Glory to God!

I'm going to read from **1 Peter**. I have preached on this message a few Sundays ago, maybe a month and a half ago, but I never went to verses 8 and 9 so let us just continue with this message.

1 Peter 1:

3 Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,

4 and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade.

It says here that, by His great mercy has given us new birth. Now, if you go and read **Psalm 103**, you will see that the scripture says, especially from verse 14, man's flesh and the ability to provide life for himself is so limited. It is only a 70, 80, 90year ability of which when you get older, when you get into your 60s, 70s... I mean thank God today I find people at 60, 70, very strong but you definitely feel that your strength is fading and you realize your inability. And God says that it is like the flower of the grass... it is there today. It's beautiful! As we drive here, in this rain season, we see the lilies just everywhere so beautiful and he says that man's glory is like that. It is here today and gone tomorrow. What is meant by that is that man's ability to preserve his own life is only as long as what he's got the strength in his flesh. And who of us can preserve our own life longer than 150 years? Nobody! Nobody becomes 150... but about 120, that's a miracle! What about a

hundred? If you become 100, you can make the news! Then if you are 75 and you are walking and all of that and you are still jogging or something like that, people will be amazed. That's the kind of a thing. So, our strength to preserve our life is very weak. Now what has happened is many of us just thought of our lives as that which we have as living inside a body and in that way, we've tried to say, "Well, our lives are preserved in being spirits." I've preached about this many times but I want to say to you that the scripture says that man is like the grass. He's here today and gone tomorrow. There's not even a remembrance of it.

Then if you read on in **Psalm 103**, he says, "Therefore God has provided what is eternal as the foundation of our life." And what is eternal is His mercy. So what God is saying is, "Because My mercy is eternal, because My grace is eternal, I'll provide My mercy to these weak vessels as the source of life for them. So, forever they will live by My mercy." Isn't that wonderful! God said, "Forever My mercy, My kindness, My love, My grace, will be the source of your life." Isn't that awesome! And by the mercy of God, He has provided the Man, Jesus Christ, as the One through Him we have access to eternal life.

Now with that in mind, Peter writes:

3 Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth

So, how do you have new birth? We have new birth by the mercy of God. It never ceases to amaze me how one can preach mercy in a church and you can find the preacher stand up and speak against the mercy of God and put the emphasis on your own works and your own ability. But when he sins or when she sins, then they make use of mercy but the congregation must live by their own works. They get judged according to their own works and they must do better and they must be a better themselves with this and that and whatever method there is. Where Peter writes, he says, "By His great mercy He's given us new birth." In other words, we are a new people. We are a new creation. And the new creation that we have is that we are a new kind of a people for we are expecting the resurrection, eternal life. I hope you can see how the gospel is not a good news message of another place but Earth. It's a good news message and I've said it before, "It is not how God can get you out of hell but how God can get the hell out of Earth by what He is doing. He's come to give us life, Church! He's come to take death from the Earth. He's come to take death even from your flesh.

It's a difficult thing for the Church many times, and I don't want to point my fingers to the Church. I'm just speaking in general. Those of you who watch my messages regularly will know what I am talking about but there may be some people watching this for the very first time. Every day we have new people listening to our messages, subscribing to our YouTube channel and so forth. Maybe you are listening to this for the very first time. I want to tell you that God's vision is not to see how we can get you out of Earth. God's vision is to make your stay in Earth permanent. Even if you die, He will raise you from the dead and you will life forever because He has a plan to bring His life to this Earth. And your life, our life, cannot be put into the cradle or into the hands of our own ability. It is impossible! We are standing in the power of God! So, he says here, "By His mercy His given us new birth." So, we cannot reject the mercy of God. We can always say that the

Gospel must be the Gospel of His mercy. By His mercy, He has given us new birth. By His mercy, or we can all it His love, He has given us the Christ. By His mercy He has given us the hope of eternal life.

Listen to this: 1 Peter 1:

3... he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead (I hope you see that),

4 and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade.

So, what will the Christian inherit? The Christian would inherit the Earth. The Bible says, "Blessed are the meek for they will inherit the Earth." This Earth that we will inherit and this inheritance, the fact that we will inherit this and the life that will be in this Earth and in our lives that we will inherit is eternal life. It can never perish, spoil or fade. We are into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade. It's not that our inheritance is just sure that we will have an inheritance. It is that what we will inherit will never perish, spoil or fade. What will the believer inherit? The believer will inherit the Earth, Glory to God! We are not here to leave. We are here to stay. Glory to the Lord! And that gives me a lot of hope. That is why when we are working in an area like what we are working in, where things are remote, where things are difficult, where things are not easy, where we can find persecution, I mean, I want to tell you, man... maybe one day I will share about this... but we find persecution, real persecution, you know, that can be serious. You know, not a persecution like somebody saying something bad about you... talking about some stuff that can have serious consequences.

What makes us continue? The simple fact that the Bible says we don't look at our persecution for the scripture says, Paul says, "We don't look at what is temporal." When you read 2Corinthians 4, he is saying that his persecution is temporal... that evil in this world is temporal. But we look at what is eternal, the resurrected Christ who would return to the Earth, who would raise Jesus from the dead, would raise those who believed in Jesus, from the dead and so all of creation will even be changed. And we would find that our inheritance, which is the kingdom of God in the Earth, is eternal, cannot perish, can never fade away. So, Helena and I, as we are here, and you there are listening to this message that believe in the gospel, that have a life that is born from the Good News of Jesus, from His mercy, we have been begotten and new afresh. We have a new life that is now born from the hope and the expectation of eternal life wherein we have an inheritance that cannot fade away because of the glory of Jesus Christ. That makes whatever we do in this world that is born from God as to pertain to the preaching of the gospel, eternal! It can never pass away! No work that we do here can pass away. It's eternal. This message that you listen to, as it has an effect in your heart and you believe in, continual to believe in this gospel, is eternal, can never fade away. This effect it has in you will have eternal consequences, glory to God, which would not be on some other planet somewhere called heaven. No, on this Earth it's eternal. That's why in this revelation, Helena and I, as we are preaching the Gospel, we don't feel that we work for a crown in heaven one day. No! Everything that is happening here is not we, who work. It is Christ who is working inside us. We stand in weakness as pertaining to our own abilities. We stand in weaknesses pertaining to doing everything right all the time. We

stand in the power of His grace, in the power of His goodness. We minister here and we know whatsoever is happening here in this broadcast, as we go to Missouri, we'll preach in the United States. None of that is temporal. Everything is eternal because we are taking part in an eternal kingdom. You know, so many times we want to be some part of something that lasts. We don't want just a short-term solution. We want to be part of something that is eternal and I want to tell you that God has brought His eternal Kingdom to the Earth and we find that overlapping that I've preached about so many times and we already start to see the first fruit of it.

(And I always forget to say this: If anyone, and we do have several invitations already but anyone else would like for us to come and minister in your area in the United States, let us know before time that we can arrange this. We would love to come and just encourage people. Be it from a Church home group... whatever you guys want. We would just like to come and serve people with the Good News.)

Let's read on...

1 Peter 1:

4 and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil, or fade. This inheritance is kept in heaven for you,

5 who through faith are shielded by God's power until the coming of the salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time.

He says that this inheritance is Christ's full life in the flesh. It's kept in the heaven. That means that Christ cannot pass away. We should not see Heaven as some other place. See Heaven as the condition of eternal. So, when Heaven comes to Earth, Earth is swallowed up by Heaven. Then Heaven is on Earth and Heaven, the eternal abode of what is eternal, or the place of eternal, then comes to the Earth and Heaven swallows up Earth and Earth is taken up into the condition of Heaven which is eternal.

So, Jesus Christ is not kept in Earth where things are temporal. He's kept in Heaven which is eternal and He will come to the Earth wherein whatever He has been depositing and working in the Earth will be manifested in its full glory. Hallelujah! Nothing you do that is born from God, is temporal. It is eternal. And this Jesus is shielded and our salvation is shielded, greatly revealed in the last time. Amen

Let me read verse 4 again:

And into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade. This inheritance is kept in heaven for you,

5 who through faith are shielded (This inheritance is kept in heaven for you, who through faith are shielded) by God's power until the coming of the salvation that is **ready to be revealed in the last time.** are shielded. Can you see this inheritance is a Who. It's Christ. So, what we are to inherit is the Earth, this Earth, and the life of the person Christ in us where this whole Earth shall be filled with that glory! Isn't that absolute Good News! That is the Good News of Jesus Christ! Hallelujah!

6 in all this you greatly rejoice, though how for a little while you many have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials.

It says, "rejoicing in this". Christ is the One that we inherit. The Earth is what we will inherit. So, if some would say, "Bertie, now are we inheriting the Earth or inheriting Christ?" Both! We are inheriting Christ. In Christ we are inheriting the very full life of God. In Colossians it is written this way: In Him you are complete. In whom the fullness of the Godhead dwells bodily and you are complete in Him. This completion, this life that is Christ, is saved and preserved safely for us. So, as it returns, we will find that creation waits for the manifestation of the sons of God. In other words, God, to reveal who His true sons are as He revealed that Christ was His Son, not just by a voice that came from Heaven that says, "This is My Son", but according to **Romans1:4**, in raising Christ from the dead He revealed His Son. So, we will be revealed as sons by being raised from the dead and so will inherit the Earth as the place of rulership which would be eternal blessed with the life of God as our inheritance.

Now, I want to tell you this: I don't just want to inherit the Earth. I'm in no need of a planet. I'm in need of the very life of God but it's beautiful that we will inherit this whole place as the place where our life, the fullness of our life, would live and it's beautiful to know that nothing we do here is for nothing. It is like seed being planted. It's the most beautiful way that I can say this. You know, if we look at this Earth, you can sow seed and as you sow seed (I'm not talking about offerings and money now. I'm talking about the preaching of the Gospel and the word that's being spread.) As that word is spread in this Earth and falls in this Earth it might look as what it is dry as if there is nothing. But that Word is the Word of Christ and as Christ returns and the final reign of the return of Christ falls on this Earth and the seed is raised from the dead, we'll find that the work that was done in this Earth stands up in this Earth eternally. We are not doing things for nothing. We are not giving for nothing. We are not sponsoring for nothing. It is part of the eternal kingdom. It's part of the life of God that is inside us. Not one word of encouragement you give somebody is not for nothing. It will have its eternal effect if it's born from God. When it is born from God it's when it comes from the mercy of the Lord that gives new life to you. It comes from a life that's revealed, manifested, because of how loved you are where your identity is in Christ. Glory to God!

1 Peter 1:

6 in all this you greatly rejoice, though how for a little while you many have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials.

You might suffer grief in all kinds of trials

7 These have come so that the proven genuineness of your faith—of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire—may result in praise, glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed

It says, "Listen man, these things have come. We will continue to believe and people will see and we, ourself, we will see the genuineness of our faith and as a genuineness of our faith is standing, that means in this context that even if you are persecuted you continue to believe in the love of God, continue to manifest in you. People will see that and will

result to the praise of the glory of God in the day of Jesus. So, we are not giving up. What he is saying is that we are continuing to believe even if we are persecuted and it will result in more people receiving Jesus Christ and much more which I'm not going to get into now.

8 Though you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy, 9 for you are receiving the end result of your faith, the salvation of your souls.

What they are saying is, as you are now, the message that you've received is the end result of your faith, the salvation of your souls. You are continuing to believe in Him even if you have not seen Him. This is something that I believe Peter is amazed at. He's saying, "I've seen Him and I've believed upon Him. I've known Him. I've believed upon Him but, you, though you have not seen Him, you've loved Him. And even though you have not seen Him now, you're not seeing Jesus now, not as if He's appeared, that is if you can see Him. He says, "you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy. Why are we happy? Because this joy is the receiving of the end result of our faith, the salvation of your souls.

So, Paul is saying that our life is being saved as we believe upon Jesus. That's why, even in difficult times, we are finding joy now. That is the first fruit of the gospel. Isn't that so, so powerful!

(??? Should this be omitted????what they are saying is being saved as we believe, "As you are now, the message that you've received is the end result of your faith, the salvation of your souls. You are continuing to believe in Him even if you have not seen Him. This is something that I believe Peter is amazed at. He's saying that I've seen Him and I've believed upon Him I've known Him. I've believed upon Him but you, *though you have not seen Him, you've loved Him.* Now, you're not seeing Jesus now but if He's appeared that is if you can see Him. He says, "You have believed in Him)

He is now talking about this power of the Resurrection.

2 Peter 1:

3 His divine power has given us everything we need for a godly life through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness.

So, we are called by the goodness of God. The only way that we can evangelize and bring the Gospel to people is by calling them by the goodness of God. So, we bring the goodness forth and that's by which we call people.

4 Through these he has given us his very great and precious promises, so that through them you may participate in the divine nature, having escaped the corruption in the world caused by evil desires.

5 For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge;

6 and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness;

7 and to godliness, mutual affection; and to mutual affection, love.

So, if we look at this, God has come and has given us new birth. He has given us a new life. And even if we go through difficult times, even if we go through some form of a persecution, even if we go through some form of a difficult time, it is just temporal. It's not something we can look at as something that is eternal. Our inheritance is Christ in the Earth. The Bible says so clearly in Matthew, "The meek will inherit the Earth." The inheritance that we will have, on account of the inheritance we have in Christ, which is eternal life is that we will inherit the kingdom and eternal Earth. We will eternally rule and reign with Jesus Christ in the Earth in life... In absolute joy, peace and love. Who of us does not seek the Earth to be full of joy, peace and love! Who of us does not seek a country that is heaven on Earth? Who of us does not seek a piece of property somewhere where there is peace and tranquility? Who of us does not seek relationship with people where people love one another, are generous and kind towards one another where we will never have where we love one another, appreciate one another, and when none of those people can ever die!

Now it's easy to say to people now, "Well, I don't care if I die. You know if bad things happen to me, I don't care. Even if I die, I don't care!" But bring that to your loved one. Try to say that about your child... "Well, I don't care if he dies." "I don't care if she goes wrong!" No! You DO care! Why? Because inside all of our DNA, it is written that God has written eternity in our hearts that eternal life is supposed to be for us and in this world and that is what you already carry. That is the life that is already inside you. Never think something is for nothing.

I'm not saying that hard times has a purpose in the sense that I'm suffering for a reason and that kind of a thing. No. What I'm saying is, "Never think that this gospel and knowing this truth, listening to this message that you are listening today is for nothing. It is eternal life that is written in our hearts and that is what God is bringing forth in this Earth. Glory to God! Know that you are deeply loved. You are cared for by God and He cares for you! If you have any problems, I'm talking about things that really bother you, where you have real pain. I want to tell you that when I and Helena, many people go through those difficult times, don't think that that will not tempt you to a place where you will say, "Oh, Lord, where are You? Why are You not helping me?" Where you say, "Lord, if You could remove this from my life then that could be better." That wasn't the life of Paul. Jesus was in the desert. He was tempted. The devil said to him, "Ah, you're saying that God is Your Father. Where's God? Where's God? Come on, be your own God now and make your life better. Take the stones and turn it into bread." That's what was being said. He was tempted.

What does "tempted" mean? When you are tempted to do something, it was this way. When we think of Jesus being tempted, we think that, "Ah, you know Jesus is tempted. It was just a difficult time He went through. No! If you want to understand tempted, imagine you are married or you have a boyfriend or a girlfriend and they're now tempted to go and be with someone else. That means there is a drawing there. Something is pulling.

Something is saying that it is like being tempted to do it. Jesus was tempted. He was tempted by the devil. But, yet, in that temptation He remembered the voice of the Father. The voice of the Father was, "You are My Son!" He stood in that and He knew that although the devil tells Him, "Whatever you do is temporal now. It cannot stand forever. Where's your sonship?" He says, "Well, I'm not going to prove My Sonship. I know what God has said and I will not live by bread alone but I will only by every word that comes from the mouth of the Father." And we find that truth. Isn't Jesus' work eternal in the Earth? Yes! Was His work removed to heaven when He ascended on high? No! When He ascended on high His work continued in the Earth and we find how eternal His work is in the Earth. Let us not have a mentality that this Earth is in disarray and there will never be order and that everything is worse and everything is bad and all those kinds of things. Let me tell you something. I've come out to Karabo here. We don't have the news. Internet is slow. We don't watch those things and it's all of a sudden, the world is such a peaceful place. Do we have problems? Yes, but we find that we are focusing on what is in the immediate area here and we find the love of God in us and we just live it and we find peace to a great degree. Do we find our persecution? Yes. Are there people that will be against you? Of course! But we are not going to stumble over that. People that are oppressing the Gospel against the Gospel that just want things for own gain, that want to slander your name, that want to do that, are we going to have our life now born from that? No, we don't have our life born from that. That's nothing compared to the power of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Who can curse what God has blessed! No one!

So, I want to encourage you. Whatever you are going through, know that the work of God has started in you, He will finish. He will complete it. He is the Alpha and the Omega. He's not the Alpha and you are the Omega. No. Unfortunately there are theologians, even those that I really respect, that think that Jesus the Alpha that started the work and now we are in partnership with Jesus and we are the co-omega. No! He is the Omega as well. All that we do is we believe and as we believe upon Him, we find that He works in us and the work that He does in us is a work that He's doing in the Earth and Jesus continues to work. Jesus never stopped the work even when He sat down at the right hand of the Father, He did not sit down at the right hand of the Father for the purpose of doing nothing. No! The Bible says that if after He sat down at the right hand of Father, He poured out His Spirit. That means He is doing something. He confirmed His Word through signs, wonders and miracles. He worked with the Word. He's still working. Jesus never stopped to do His work. He is continuing in the Earth. What He's started, He's continuing in the Earth. What He started is completing and we are part of that and we will find that our life, our eternal inheritance which is the fullness of Christ. There is no such word as eternality but to be eternal even in our flesh and this Earth being swallowed up by God and His kingdom. That is where we are heading and it cannot stop.

I want to tell you when that becomes your mentality, it's much easier to go through a difficult time because you know that what God is doing, the work that is being happened, the message that I preach, I'm talking about my own life, the people that encourage, those that would write us a message of encouragement, "This is a blessing, Bertie!" ... whatever. That's eternal. The people that sponsor the ministry, that is eternal work. You are not part of something that is temporal, passing away... "Although you know, I don't

know anymore ... like that" No! It's the work of God! It's eternal. It is part of what God is doing. It is not something that you do here so that you can qualify to go to heaven one day. No! It is what God is doing! Amen! God hasn't put people on Earth to see if they live good enough so that they can jump to the next level. No! He is doing a work in the Earth and He is bringing Heaven to Earth and He's bringing His life and His rule and His kingdom into this Earth. And that is what we are part of and that excites me! Glory to God! That empowers me! It is beautiful. That makes it nothing to do what we are doing. It is not even an effort. It's effortless! Hallelujah! It can be described as hard work by others but I just even feel ashamed to say that this is hard work by us. It is not a hard work! It is simple. It is easy. It's the work of God. It's the power of the Resurrection born from the hope and the revelation of what is happening in the Earth through Jesus.

You are deeply loved, Church! You are deeply loved. Let us lift our eyes and put our eyes on the Lord Jesus Christ. Let us remember His prayer:

"Our Father which art in Heaven..." Let me change the words into what can be meant by that: "Father, the One that gives birth to my life which is in the domain of eternal. You can never die. You can never pass away. Your rule of life... Come."

What I mean by that is, "Let it be on Earth just as it is in Heaven." How is it in heaven? That's the place where there is no death. There is no destruction. There's no corruption but it is only beauty in life. Let it be like that on Earth and while we are not seeing all of that, thank You that I can now say that You are the Source of everything I eat and live.

Give us this day our daily bread. I say and I acknowledge, I accept the manna that falls from heaven. I accept Jesus. I am saying to you, "Give to us Jesus every day. I'm accepting You, Father.

Deliver us from our trespasses as we are seeing that all people are delivered by Your work. We are not seeing Jew and Gentile anymore. We are seeing and accepting Your oneness that You brought between Jew and Gentile." Hallelujah!

Father, deliver us from evil because we cannot go to the government to deliver us from evil. Our money can't deliver us from evil. Our family, Father, cannot deliver us from evil.
